On May 4, 2012, you were invited to the Office of the Dean of Student Services for an investigation regarding a paper published by you. Upon your arrival, a copy of the paper was handed to you followed by a question to ascertain whether you wrote it. Confidently, you acquiesced to publishing that paper.

The publication of this document, which is believed to be in circulation or on the internet, is tantamount to defaming the reputation of the entire Administration of this institution and to jeopardize national and international supports to the institution. Not all, but to cause chaos among peaceful workers and students. As a student of Cuttington University and a journalist, you cannot use your profession in journalism to obliterate the good image of the institution that is nurturing you educationally, thereby violating its rules and regulations.

According to the Revised Student Handbook, page 13, count 12: Any student, who writes, makes defamatory statements, posts, distributes any fliers, pamphlets, or newsletters, incites, offers to riot, demonstrate or strike, carries news against other students, Administration or other University Employees and Government Officials, shall be guilty of a major offense. Penalty for this violation shall range from 50 hours of hard labor to SUSPENSION/EXPULSION as the gravity of the case might warrant.

Therefore, you are suspended for **ONE SEMESTER** beginning May 10, 2012. We expect you back in September 2012/ 2013.
