Who We Are

The Committee to Protect Journalists was founded over 40 years ago as a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization with the mission of defending journalists who report the news despite facing tremendous risks.

Over the years, our advocacy has helped win dozens of positive legal reforms, convictions in scores of journalist murders, and the release of hundreds of jailed journalists. CPJ has also provided direct assistance to thousands of journalists all over the world. Today, we are recognized as a leader in the global fight to protect press freedom.

Why Partner With CPJ?

To support CPJ is to advance press freedom at the highest levels and provide immediate, high-impact relief to journalists in dire need around the world. Your investment will make a crucial difference in the lives of embattled journalists worldwide.

While many organizations are engaged in research, analysis and advocacy, CPJ is one of the few global press freedom organizations with a mandate to provide direct assistance to journalists in need. We work in over 120 countries providing safety advice, help with relocation, assistance for medical or psychosocial needs, legal support, and more. Since 2019, CPJ's journalist assistance fund has grown five-fold — there is a dire and growing need for our assistance across the globe.

Since our founding over four decades ago, we have earned our reputation as a reliable and leading source of credible information on press freedom issues and a trusted advocate for journalists under threat around the world. Our research is the gold standard in the field of press freedom.

How We Protect Journalists

Direct Assistance and Trainings

We offer physical, digital, and physiological support to journalists all over the world and provide detailed safety information to them in the form of one-on-one consultations and group workshops. Our Gene Roberts Fund for Emergency Assistance dispenses emergency grants to journalists in distress worldwide. We work to prevent deaths, detentions, kidnappings, and other dangers through information sharing and practical guidance, while providing on-the-ground advocacy and rapid response support to those who are injured, imprisoned, or forced to flee because of their work.

Crisis Response

Journalists are the world's eyes and ears on the ground when crises emerge. Whereas other groups focus on support for journalists in the mid- to long-term, CPJ serves as the "ambulance" to address their immediate needs. When conflict erupts, as we have seen in Afghanistan, Ukraine, and Gaza, we quickly identify journalists' most pressing needs — whether they be emergency first aid kits, relocation assistance, or trauma support — scale our response rapidly, and effectively partner with other organizations to maximize our impact.

Freeing Imprisoned Journalists

We document each journalist's detention and advocate on their behalf. We carry out "Free the Press" campaigns each year and raise the issue of imprisonment in our meetings with leaders from all over the world. And each year, we honor an imprisoned journalist at our International Press Freedom Awards ceremony in hopes of accelerating their release.

Winning Justice in Journalist Murders

When a journalist is murdered, we talk to their family and friends, we consult their colleagues, and we speak to police and local authorities. We conduct advocacy and report on the murder in our work, making sure to highlight the issue with our partners. We call on local and national authorities to ensure the killers are brought to justice. We also publish an Impunity Index each year, which highlights those countries where journalists are killed and their murderers go free.

Since 2018, we have provided over \$2.2 million in financial assistance to journalists in need.
In 2023 we supported 719
journalists from 59 countries, providing physical and digital safety advice, letters of support, and other guidance to nearly 300
journalists and financial assistance totaling over \$687,000.

Programmatic Support

In our work to keep journalists safe and free from emerging threats across the world, several priority areas have taken shape. Your support of one of CPJ programs will enable us to address the most urgent threats to journalists and most pressing crosscutting issues in press freedom.

Crisis Response

Large-scale crises, including the ongoing wars in Gaza, Ukraine, and Sudan, pose magnified and sustained threats to journalists and journalism.

These crises cause dramatic spikes in urgent requests for journalists' assistance in the short term. However, the prolonged and protracted nature of these crises tremendously impact journalists' well-being in the long term, giving



rise to complex needs such as exile and trauma support.

Support for this body of work will fund:

- Increasing the number of staff providing safety information, support, and research: CPJ has undergone tremendous growth the past two years, increasing our capacity to respond more swiftly and effectively to increasing requests for help. We are continuing to invest in our staff, with special emphasis on specialist regional and assistance expertise to provide more targeted information in a timely manner to journalists around the world.
- **Growing our Journalist Assistance Fund:** In 2023 we provided nearly \$700,000 in financial assistance to journalists in need around the world, the largest amount in CPJ's history. Recognizing the incredible demand for CPJ's emergency financial assistance from journalists in need across the globe, we have doubled our Gene Roberts Emergency Fund for journalist assistance to \$1 million in 2024.
- Building a safety trends forecasting capability: We are commissioning a needs analysis and designing a mechanism that would allow CPJ to anticipate emerging threats and enable us to quickly deploy resources where they are most needed.

Exile Support

Press freedom's global decline has led to an increasing number of people forced to flee their homes and upend their lives. More than 30% of our assistance grants in 2023 covered expenses to help journalists leave their country of origin or settle and begin a new life in their host country. Out of all journalists financially supported in 2023, spanning all needs, over 58% were living in exile.

Funding for this body of work will:

- **Provide life-saving financial assistance:** We provide emergency grants to journalists in distress which cover costs of fleeing their country of origin or their basic needs as they rebuild their lives in a new country and continue their vital journalism work.
- **Help journalists seek refuge:** We provide letters of support to journalists to assist with visa applications, connect journalists with fellowship opportunities, and advise on navigating immigration structures in exile.
- Advocate for emergency visas: Over the years, we have seen our advocacy successfully secure emergency relocation visas for journalists to a number of countries, and we continue to advocate with governments for their wider availability.

Psychosocial & Trauma Support

A combination of repeated exposure to traumatic events, a growing exile crisis, the threat or experience of arrest, detention or harm, financial insecurity, long hours, and increasing hostility towards the media all contribute to psychological distress for journalists. The need for mental health support is growing rapidly. In 2023 CPJ provided support to nearly 150 journalists for trauma needs, over three times the number of journalists assisted with trauma needs in 2022.

Funding for this body of work will:

- **Provide individual and group emergency grants:** We provide emergency grants to journalists in distress to cover the costs of one-on-one therapy or mental health support.
- **Sponsor group mental health workshops:** When more culturally or contextually appropriate, we provide group workshops to help more journalists at once and address specific needs. In 2023 we initiated group mental health workshops for Burmese and Russian journalists living in exile and a rest and respite initiative for journalists covering the conflict in Sudan.

Technology & Digital Safety


Those who seek to silence and harm journalists are now able to do so from behind a screen. CPJ is closely monitoring and quickly reacting to the dramatic increase in threats to journalists' digital security, including surveillance and threats to privacy, online harassment, internet shutdowns, efforts to criminalize and censor news online, digital forensic technologies, and the emergent threats and opportunities posed by AI for press freedom.

Funding for this body of work will:

- Provide digital safety training: We provide guidance and training to
 journalists through one-on-one consultations and group workshops, and
 share resources for journalists including <u>Digital Safety Kits</u>, spyware-specific
 safety notes, and <u>risk assessments</u>.
- **Conduct high-level advocacy:** Under the leadership of our new Technology Advocacy Manager, we are scaling our work documenting digital threats to journalists and building our capacity to engage with technology companies, policymakers, regulators, and other stakeholders on issues at the nexus of press freedom and technology.

Climate Change

As our changing climate unfolds into numerous global crises, environmental coverage has emerged as one of the world's most crucial journalistic beats. Critical information from reporters across the globe is essential not only to keeping us informed about our changing planet but also enables us to respond effectively to this existential threat.

- **Provide direct assistance:** We field and respond to financial and non-financial requests to support reporters facing challenges due to their environmental coverage.
- **Invest in research:** We are investing in a climate fellow to evaluate and assess our existing data on press freedom violations related to climate reporting and recommend interventions.
- Advocate for journalists: We pursue justice for journalists such as British freelance journalist Dom Phillips, who was shot and killed during a reporting trip in the Brazilian Amazon in June 2022.
