Subject: Strengthening press freedom and journalist safety in Tamil Nadu through electoral commitment

Respected Honorable Chief Minister,

As Tamil Nadu prepares for the upcoming state assembly elections in the coming weeks, the Committee to Protect Journalists (CPJ), an independent, nonprofit press freedom organization, respectfully urges your esteemed political party, Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam, to include a strong commitment to press freedom and the safety of journalists in your election manifesto.

A free, independent, and safe press is indispensable to a vibrant democracy. However, journalists across India — including in Tamil Nadu — face increasing threats to both their physical and digital security. Intimidation, harassment, surveillance, censorship, and restrictive regulations undermine the press's ability to operate independently and to serve the public's right to information.

By making an explicit electoral commitment to protect journalists and uphold press freedom, your party can demonstrate leadership in strengthening democratic values and safeguarding the role of the media in public accountability.

Key areas of concern:

Legal safety: Journalists sometimes face legal actions, bureaucratic pressure, or procedural intimidation that can restrict their ability to report freely.

Digital safety: Expansive laws and regulations can enable censorship, surveillance, and forced content takedowns, endangering journalists' work and privacy.

Physical safety: Journalists continue to face intimidation and, at times, violence, particularly while covering political events, protests, or elections.

Financial and regulatory pressures: Independent media outlets are vulnerable to punitive tax actions, bureaucratic hurdles, and funding restrictions that threaten editorial independence.

Access to information: Barriers in obtaining timely government responses, participation in official briefings, and effective use of the Right to Information Act limit the ability of journalists to inform the public.

Suggested commitments for inclusion in the election manifesto:

- Guarantee protection from harassment, detention, and violence, ensuring the physical safety of journalists.
- Safeguard digital rights by protecting against unlawful surveillance, censorship, and arbitrary removal of content.
- Uphold editorial independence by opposing laws or actions that restrict reporting and investigative journalism.
- Promote transparency by facilitating fair and timely access to government information, press briefings, and RTI responses.
- Ensure fair, transparent, and safe working conditions for journalists across Tamil Nadu.

Incorporating these commitments into your party's manifesto would strengthen Tamil Nadu's democratic foundations and reaffirm a commitment to protecting press freedom and the public's right to information.
